**Saturday, September 5, 2020 trucks arrive at 6 AM. Last feeding is Friday PM. For Beef last feeding is Friday AM.**

**Summary of Rules**

**Animal Drop Off:** Exhibitors will be on site per the schedule above. Anyone showing up outside of their scheduled time will be turned away and not allowed on grounds. Trucks and trailers will be staged in the parking lot. Nobody is allowed out of the vehicle until they are through the livestock gate. Vehicles will be allowed through the gate one at a time for unloading and then immediately exit the livestock area. Volunteers from the livestock committee and Junior Fair Board will control the vehicle traffic entering and exiting the fairgrounds. Once the animals are dropped off, they are left on grounds after the evaluation and will be loaded onto the truck Saturday, September 5<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 AM. Groups are allowed (1) representatives per species to feed and water the animals in the evening. Feeding schedule is as follows: Hogs/Beef: By 6 PM

Thursday; By 8 AM Friday; By 6 PM Friday. Beef will be loaded out Friday afternoon so their last feeding will be Friday morning.

**Sheep/Goats:** By 6 PM Friday. Hogs, sheep and goats will be loaded out 6 AM Saturday morning so their last feeding will be Friday evening.

**BREEDERS MUST SHOW AND GO. THEY MAY NOT STAY OVERNIGHT.**

**Who is allowed on grounds:** The grading event is closed to the public. Each exhibitor is allowed one parent and one leader/advisor per CLUB or CHAPTER. No more than 10 exhibitors will be allowed in the show ring at one time.

**Preventative Measures:** Temperatures will be taken at the gate. Masks will be required at all times on grounds. Everyone on grounds must sign a release provided by CDFA. Exhibitors' hands will be sanitized entering and exiting the ring. Exhibitor Handwashing stations will be provided. Sanitizing of all surfaces will take place after each show segment which includes gates, all rails, bathrooms, chutes, etc. The six-foot social distance rule will apply. We will have signage through the livestock barn area and in the show ring. No more than ten exhibitors in the show ring at a time. Livestock pens will set up with the proper social distancing requirements. Once one group finishes their show, they must leave the fairgrounds so we can prepare for the next group. Show schedules will be distributed via a QR Code and Google Documents to avoid direct contact. QR Codes will be displayed on the livestock window.

**Processing Truck Load Out:** The Livestock Superintendent will oversee the load out of the trucks. The junior livestock exhibitors will not be allowed back on grounds to assist with the loading.

PLEASE NOTE – same rule applies as the Monterey County Fair. This is a terminal sale. Please refer to local rules and state rules in the entry guidebook.
