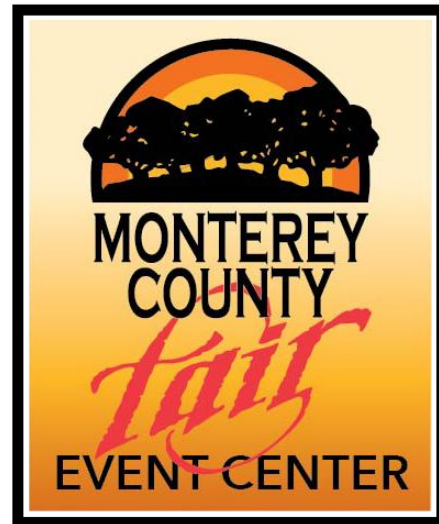

HOW TO USE OUR GUIDEBOOK AND SUBMIT ENTRIES

- Enter all exhibits online at: www.montereycountyfair.com
- Review the “Table of Contents” to discover the areas that interest you, then check due dates and deadlines.
- Each department specifies rules, regulations, entry due dates, exhibit receiving dates, and other important information.
- **PLEASE NOTE: ALL LOCAL and STATE RULES APPLY** to all Departments and Divisions.
Local Rules – Included in this guidebook.
State Rules for California Fairs – Available on the California Department of Food & Agriculture website, the Monterey County Fair Website and a copy is on file at the Monterey County Fair Livestock Office. Visit: <https://www.cdfa.ca.gov/FairsAndExpositions/>
- Complete the online entry form and submit it with entry fees, if applicable, before the due date. Mail paper entry forms to the address listed on each, or bring them to the Fair Office, 2004 Fairground Road, Monterey, CA 93940.
- Fill the forms out **COMPLETELY**, provide Division and Class numbers with descriptions or titles.
- Junior exhibitors must indicate age and have parent and/or youth organization leader’s signature.
- Divisions and Classes will be judged under the American system and/or the Danish system.
American – The judging process to rank exhibits against one another and award one first placing, one second, etc.
Danish – The judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standard and award as many first placings, etc. as merited.
- All entries **MUST BE ORIGINAL** and must have been completed by the entrant within the past year and not entered in a prior Monterey County Fair.
- All entries must be **IDENTIFIED**, preferably on back upper left corner or under base with the entrant’s name, address, phone number, Division number, Class, and title. Title must be the same as given on the online entry. All information is to be neatly hand printed or typed.

CLEAR BAG POLICY

- Bags must be clear plastic or vinyl or PVC and not exceed 12" by 6" by 12".
- without a handle or strap are permitted.
- *Exceptions may be made for medically necessary items after inspection.*
- Animals are not allowed on the Fairgrounds
- Exception may be made for approved service animals

SCREENING POLICY

To ensure a safe, pleasant, family-oriented setting, the Fair will conduct bag searches and security screening utilizing metal detectors at entrance gates.

Prohibited items on the Fairgrounds include

- Bottles, cans, glass containers, or hard sided sealed plastic bottles
- Weapons: guns, knives, mace/pepper spray/stream (or any other items that could be considered or used as weapons)
- Bicycles, skateboards, scooters, skates/rollerblades, and Segways
- Toy guns, water pistols, or imitation weapons
- Gang colors or paraphernalia
- Alcohol, cannabis products in any form, illegal substances, narcotics, any related paraphernalia
- Unauthorized flyers and leaflets
- Outside food and beverages (unless for medical reasons)
- Unmanned aerial vehicles
- Chairs, tents, tables, and large shade umbrellas
- Fireworks, firecrackers
- Any items deemed dangerous or inappropriate by Fair staff

ENTERTAINMENT AND EXHIBITS

Fair admission includes all exhibits and entertainment. Take time to visit the exhibit halls and see agricultural products, floriculture, arts and crafts, and wool.

LOCAL RULES

1. Monterey County Fair will be open to the public from September 3-7, 2026.
2. Please carefully read all the rules and regulations that pertain to your entry department.
3.  The Monterey County Fair reserves to its management the final and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations in this exhibitor handbook, and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard there to or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the Fair. The Management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules as they, in their judgment, may deem advisable, at any time.
4. Due to the limited space in the livestock area, there will be no bogus entries to subsequently use the space for storage, picnics, rest areas, etc. Storage in areas will be designated, but is limited. This rule will be strictly enforced by the Fair Management. After weigh-in, the Fair Management has the authority to change stall space as necessary. Your cooperation is expected.
5. State Rules, Health Rules and Score Cards for judging as prescribed by the Division of Fairs and Expositions apply to all entries of this Fair. A copy of the State Rules may be obtained at the local Fair Office, on our website or from the Division of Fairs and Expositions website. Questions can be answered by contacting MCF Administration Office at 2004 Fairground Road, Monterey, CA 93940, or call 831/372-5863. Submit entry forms as early as possible to ensure space for your exhibit. Official entry forms are available online: www.montereycountyfair.com. Office hours are 9:00 AM to Noon and 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday. No refunds will be given to exhibitors or organizations.
6. **PAYMENT OF FEES:** Online Entry Fees shall be paid by credit card only. Paper Entry Forms (still/non-livestock only) fees may be paid with cash or personal or business check. Monterey County Fair policy for bounced checks: \$25.00 service fee per check plus all bank fees will be added to the amount of the bounced check. Entries will not be accepted until ALL fees are paid. MCF reserves the right to refuse payment from accounts with bad credit history.
7. **ALL ONLINE ENTRY FORMS** must contain correct names, mailing address (with proper zip code), telephone number, and, for Junior entries, the age of the exhibitor. Paper Entry Forms (still/non-livestock only) must be postmarked on or before midnight for designated dates and times.
8. All drapes, hangings, curtains, drops and all other decorative materials that would tend to increase the fire and panic hazards shall be made from non-flammable material or shall be treated and maintained in a flame-retardant condition by means of a flame-retardant solution or process approved by the State Fire Marshal, as set forth in Sub Chapter 8, Chapter 1, Title 19, CAC. Exit doors, exit lights, fire alarm sending stations, wet standpipe hose cabinets, and fire extinguishers shall not be concealed or obstructed by any decorative material.
9. Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion, and other exhibits that might cause accidents, injury, or damage to people coming in contact with them shall guard their exhibits and protect the public. Every such exhibitor shall indemnify the 7th District Agriculture Association from and against all claims and demands, costs, charges, and expenses which it may incur, suffer, or be put to, by reason of any accident or of any person being injured or suffering damages.
10. As a consideration of their exhibits or participation in events on Monterey County Fairgrounds the exhibitor holds harmless the U.S. Government or other parties from which the Fair leases ground from any and all claims or demands of any kind or nature which may be incurred directly by reason of such exhibits or participation including any and all claims or demands of their agents, servants and employees, or spectators of such exhibits or events.
11. Neither the Fair Management nor Departments will they be responsible for unclaimed articles. All precautions will be taken during the Fair to protect the entries, but no liability for loss or damage from any cause can be assumed by the Department or the Fair Management. If entries are not picked up/claimed prior to one month after the last day of fair, these exhibits will be donated are discarded.
12. No signs may be placed on or at any exhibit, nor shall any advertising be posted at exhibits or animal pens without permission of Fair Management.
13. Local divisions are open only to legal residents or producers from Monterey, San Benito, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, and San Luis Obispo counties unless otherwise indicated.
14. Extended divisions include entries from California and the eleven Western States.
15. Judge(s) shall award placing according to merit; and/or without merit, judge(s) shall make no award under any circumstances. This rule applies whether there are one or more entries in the class. See State Rule II Judging (1-7).
16. Entries cannot be entered in "Any Other" classification if there is a Division and Class for the specific item.
17. Exhibits must be adequately and correctly labeled unless otherwise instructed by the rules of the Department, Division, or Class.
18. Items which have been shown/displayed at a previous Monterey County Fair are not eligible for competition.

19. WITHOUT EXCEPTION, NO EXHIBIT SHALL BE RELEASED UNTIL THE TIME AND DATE SPECIFIED IN EACH SECTION OF THE ENTRY GUIDEBOOK. All entries are to be picked up at the building or area where it was displayed, and the owner must present the claim check to the Building Clerk. No exception to this rule will be allowed without written permission from the Management of Monterey County Fair prior to the starting Fair date. Any exhibitor who removes his/her exhibit before the release date will have his/her premium monies withheld by Management.

20. PROTESTS: Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of the State or Local Rules that have not been enforced. Decisions of judges, veterinarians, weighmasters, Livestock Superintendents, breed callers, tail dock officials and timers cannot be protested and are final. All Protests must be accompanied by a deposit of \$500.00 (cash only) NOTE: The deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld.

Given the short duration of the fair:

- The protestor shall make every effort to file the protest prior to judging. All protests must be filed in writing within 24 hours of the time of the cause of the protest and before the conclusion of fair.
- The fair will make every effort to resolve protests as quickly as possible. All exhibitors by entering an exhibit and all people by filing a protest agree to cooperate with Fair Management to resolve protests in a timely manner.
- Protests shall be adjudicated by Fair Management and/or members of Board of Directors.

Any exhibit involved in a filed protest before or during judging is eligible to compete until the protest is resolved.

Classes that involve a protested exhibit will not become official until the protest is resolved.

- In championship or special award classes that involve the protested exhibit the judge shall also select 1st and 2nd runners-up in case of disqualification.
- In the case of protest, the unofficial judging results may be used to prepare the sale list and other necessary information.

At the discretion of the CEO, judging can be delayed allowing time for the Fair to resolve the protest if to do so does not unreasonably delay or disrupt the operations of the Fair judging and auction events.

All questions concerning competition or non-protestable disputes or differences with staff or the exhibition not provided for under the State or Local Rules shall be referred to fair management or their designee, whose decision shall be final.

.

No protest will be accepted unless it:

- Is filed or received, in writing, with a signed original and a signed duplicate copy.
- Clearly states which rule has been violated.
- States when the protestor first became aware of the facts and rule violation.

- States the facts relied upon for the basis of the protest.
- States that the protestor will cooperate with the investigation of the protest and that the protestor will be available and agrees to attend any hearing held to resolve the protest at the time and place directed by fair management
- Includes the names of supporting witnesses, with accessible phone numbers, and contact information and
- Describes or attaches any document relating to the protest, which must include the written decision issued by the local arbitrating body.

21. AWARDS: Ribbons and premium checks will be available at the time of release of the exhibit or will be mailed to the exhibitor according to the address printed on the online entry. \$50.00 will be charged for all replacement checks. All checks must be cashed in within 90 days. NO checks will be issued after 90 days. Livestock premium checks will be presented to exhibitors on the date assigned by Fair annually. Premium Awards and Auction payments will be paid only as recorded on the signed judging sheet and/or Junior Livestock Auction sales records and only to the exhibitor. Checks may be picked up on the designated day as listed in the Entry Guidebook by the exhibitor only. If an exhibitor is under the age of 18, a parent or guardian may be designated to pick up check payment. Verification of parent or guardian will be requested at pick up.

22. Sweepstakes and Divisions Scoring will be as follows:

- 1st Place = 5 points,
- 2nd Place = 3 points,
- 3rd Place = 1 point.

23. Sweepstakes shall be awarded only when at least three (3) separate exhibitors have achieved at least a combined point total of 30 points. To receive sweepstakes awards, an exhibitor must have a minimum of 10 points. (Please see Section VI-Awards and Scoring located under State Rules.)

24. Upon signature and submittal of entry form, exhibitors and their agents, parents and leaders acknowledge that:

- a. They understand the State Rules and local fair rules.
- b. They agree to abide by these rules.
- c. They certify that all information on the form is true & accurate.
- d. They agree to comply with the fair's decision regarding any violation of the state or local rules.
- e. If it is determined there has been unethical treatment of animals or violation of state or federal regulations or of state or local fair drug policy rules, exhibitor's names will be forwarded to F & E as well as given to the Network of California fairs and to appropriate government agencies.

25. All state rules are applicable for all competitions.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT RULES

New and updated rules and regulations are noted with a



DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Monterey County Fair reserves to its management the final and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations in this exhibitor handbook, and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard there to or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the Fair. The Management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules as they, in their judgment, may deem advisable, at any time.
2. State Rules and Health Rules applicable to the Senior Department also apply to the Junior Department.
3. The Junior Livestock Exhibitor Code of Conduct applies to all Junior Livestock Departments.
4. All Junior Livestock Exhibitors are required to complete the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) Online Training. Certificate number must be inserted to ShoWorks by August 1.
5. No outside alcohol is allowed to be brought into or stored in the livestock area. Only alcohol provided by the Master Concessionaire is allowed on the grounds. If caught with outside alcohol, you will be removed from the Fairgrounds for the remainder of the Fair.
6. All exhibitors are required to email in a completed Junior Livestock Exhibitor/Parent Code of Conduct by August 1 to entry@montereycountyfair.com
7. All exhibitors are required to submit Storm Water Survey online no later than August 1.
8. Junior Livestock Exhibitors must enter all exhibits online at: www.montereycountyfair.com. This includes entry for Market, Showmanship, and a Still entry, including payment of applicable entry fees, before stated due dates.
9. **Showmanship is Mandatory** for ALL Junior Livestock Market Animal Exhibitors, **excluding all poultry and rabbit exhibitors.**
10. Pre-entry for Bred & Fed is mandatory for anyone eligible and wishing to participate.
11. ALL SWINE EXHIBITORS are required to email Prop 12 Certificate from breeder to entry@montereycountyfair.com by August 1st at 11:59 pm.
-  12. **All market animals must be pre-entered by indicated ownership deadline. ALL Market Animals must be tagged with their official Monterey County Fair assigned Ear Tag prior to arrival on grounds. Ear Tags will be provided to all exhibitors prior to fair.**
13. Livestock exhibitors shall fulfill completion of all items in the Entry Checklist on page 4.
14. The MCF Official Vet and MCF Management will have the final and official decision regarding all things pertaining to animal health and safety.

4-H REQUIREMENTS

Complete show attire is required for all 4-H Exhibitors while competing in all Divisions and while receiving awards during the 2026 Monterey County Fair.

DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

- Solid White Dress Shirt, Long or Short sleeved, collared, button or snap front. Shirts should be tucked in. No T-shirts, Polo Shirts or Sleeveless shirts allowed.
- Clean, White Ankle Length Pants. No Black Pants.
- 4-H Collar or 4-H Tie
- 4-H Cap
- Belts are to be worn if Belt Loops are on pants.

- Boots – If boots are worn, they must be inside pant legs. Footwear must be clean and/or polished. No Sandals or open-toed shoes are to be worn while showing. Tennis Shoes are discouraged.

AGE REQUIREMENTS

Levels of 4-H membership are age based. Each level is defined as follows:

- Primary Level: Must be 5 years old as of December 31, 2025 to exhibit at Fair. Primary membership ends when members qualify as Junior members. Exhibitors who are under 9 years of age on or before December 31, 2025, are not eligible to compete in large animal (Beef, Sheep, Swine, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Boer Goats, Market & Fiber Goats, Horse & Llama) competitions at California Fairs.
- Junior, Intermediate, and Senior: Must be at least 9 years old on or before December 31, 2025. Exhibitors are eligible to compete through Dec. 31 of the year, which they turn 19 years of age.

FFA REQUIREMENTS

The official uniform of the organization is required for all FFA Exhibitors while competing in all Divisions and while receiving awards during the 2026 Monterey County Fair.

DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

- White trousers. No Black Pants.
- White dress shirt or blouse (long or short sleeved), with the FFA emblem attached to the left pocket and the official FFA four-in-hand necktie.
- The official FFA jacket is optional (if worn, the shirt emblem is not required)
- Belts are to be worn if Belt Loops are on pants.
- Boots – If boots are worn, they must be inside pant legs. Footwear must be clean and/or polished. NO Sandals or open-toed shoes are to be worn while showing. Tennis Shoes are discouraged.
- Hats or headgear of any kind shall not be worn with the official show uniform while showing at Fairs and Livestock Shows.

AGE REQUIREMENTS

- FFA members may participate as members until the end of the calendar year following the year of graduation from high school. (For example, a graduate this year is eligible until Dec. 31 next year.)

GRANGE REQUIREMENTS

DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

- Solid White Dress Shirt, Long or Short sleeved, collared, button or snap front. Shirts should be tucked in. No T-shirts, Polo Shirts or Sleeveless shirts allowed.
- Red Grange Vest
- Dark Blue Jeans
- Belts are to be worn if Belt Loops are on pants.
- Boots – If boots are worn, they must be inside pant legs. Footwear must be clean and/or polished. NO Sandals or open-toed shoes are to be worn while showing. Tennis Shoes are discouraged.

AGE REQUIREMENTS

- Grange youth members must be at least 5 years old on Jan. 1, 2026, to exhibit. They may exhibit until the end of the calendar year in they reach age 19. All Grange youth members must be at least 9 years old on January 1, 2026, to exhibit large animals (Beef, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Swine, Sheep, Boer Goats, and Market Goats).

INDEPENDENT YOUTH REQUIREMENTS

DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

- White Trousers or Blue Jeans
- Solid White Dress Shirt, Long or Short sleeved, collared, button or snap front. Shirts should be tucked in. No T-shirts, Polo Shirts or Sleeveless shirts allowed.
- Belts are to be worn if Belt Loops are on pants.
- Boots – If boots are worn, they must be inside pant legs. Footwear must be clean and/or polished. NO Sandals or open-toed shoes are to be worn while showing. Tennis Shoes are discouraged.
- Hats or headgear of any kind shall not be worn while showing at Fairs and Livestock Shows.

AGE REQUIREMENTS

- Independent exhibitors must be at least 9 years old by January 1, 2026. Exhibitors are eligible to complete/exhibit through December 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years old.
- Exhibitors 13 years old and younger as of January 1, 2026, must enter 4-H Divisions (including Showmanship).
- Exhibitors 14 years old and older as of January 1, 2026, must enter FFA Divisions (including Showmanship).

PARTICIPATION & ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Independent Junior Exhibitors must complete the MCF Independent Exhibitor Affidavit Application, as well as submit a letter to MCF Fair Management requesting to show as an Independent Exhibitor no later than April 1st, 2026. NO Late applications will be accepted.
- Two non-parental letters of recommendation must accompany the letter to fair management requesting to be an Independent Exhibitor.
- Independent Junior Exhibitors entering animals must meet all Ownership Requirements for their animals. Independent Exhibitors must include a photo, proof of ownership and ear tags or ear notch information when turning in affidavit.
- Independent Market Animal Exhibitors are required to show proof of liability insurance.
- Exhibitors enrolled in any junior organization for which classes are offered elsewhere are not eligible to enter as Independent Exhibitors.


ENTRY INFORMATION

1. All required entry forms must be signed by the appropriate advisor, leader and/or parent/guardian for the exhibitor to enter in the MCF.
2. Exhibitors who are enrolled in any 4-H, FFA, Grange, or Open Junior group in Poultry or Rabbit Divisions are NOT eligible to enter Senior Poultry or Rabbit Divisions or Vice Versa. Exception to this rule, see State Rule VII Junior Department – Senior Department Restrictions Rule 22. A, B, & C.
3. **ALL Junior Livestock Exhibitors** (Monterey, Santa Cruz, and San Benito Counties) at Monterey County Fair must enter at least one still project for exhibit in this year's Fair. **All still projects must be entered into and delivered on their specific dates. NO LIVESTOCK PROJECTS WILL BE ACCEPTED IF THIS RULE IS NOT MET. ANIMALS WILL BE SENT HOME. NO EXCEPTIONS.** All other rules in the Entry Guidebook apply.
 - **4-H and FFA Livestock Exhibitors** are to submit still entries through the 4-H & FFA Department.
 - **Independent and Grange Livestock Exhibitors** are to submit still entries through the Junior Home Arts Department.
4. County, District, and State Fairs cannot legally carry liability insurance covering junior exhibitors and/or their exhibits. Liability insurance is the responsibility and discretion of the junior exhibitor. Therefore, it is

suggested that junior exhibitors consider taking out a liability policy covering themselves and their exhibits. All Independent Market Animal Exhibitors are required to show proof of liability insurance. All other Junior Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to carry liability insurance. A policy may be purchased through California Fair Services Authority for a minimal cost. Call the Fair office at 831/372-5863 for assistance.

5. Breeding, Market Animals, and Rabbits are limited to members of 4-H, FFA, Grange and Independent junior exhibitors located in Monterey, Santa Cruz, and San Benito Counties. Poultry entries are open to the State of California and Nevada. Market and Breeding Beef Divisions are open to Monterey, San Benito, and Santa Cruz Counties. Dairy Cattle is open to Monterey, Santa Cruz, and San Benito Counties. Space permitting, Dairy Goats are open to Santa Clara, Merced, Stanislaus, San Luis Obispo, and Ventura Counties.
6. **Market Animal Entry Limits** – Exhibitors can show and sell:
 - 1 Market Hog
 - 1 Market Lamb
 - 1 Market Goat
 - 1 Market Steer
 - 1 Market Steer AND 1 Market Lamb
 - 1 Market Steer AND 1 Market Hog
 - 1 Market Steer AND 1 Market Goat
7. Tack Carry Out on the last day of the Fair is not to begin until the scheduled time. If an exhibitor is found in violation of this rule, they will have ALL premiums withheld.

OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. **BREEDING ANIMALS:** Original Registration Certificate including a duplicate (not photocopy) of an Original Registration Certificate certified by a Breed Association showing proof of purchase 30 days prior to opening day of Fair. Registration Papers must be checked by the Entry Office upon arrival at the Fair.
2. **MARKET BEEF** must be owned by May 2nd, 2026.
3. **MARKET HOGS, SHEEP, and GOATS** must be owned by July 2nd, 2026.
4. **RABBITS:** Pedigree papers or Bill of Sale showing ear tattoos or other required entry information (made out to exhibitor) must be available upon request the day of the Rabbit Show.
5. **NON-REGISTERED LIVESTOCK:** Documentary proof of ownership such as a Bill of Sale or Sales Yard Out Billing (made out to exhibitor) must be available on request.
6. **MARKET BEEF EXHIBITORS** must present Bill of Sale showing ownership of the animal for 120 days at Weigh-In.
7. No substitution/replacement may be made for Market Beef 120 days, and/or Market Sheep, Market Goats, or Swine 60 days, before the first day of the Fair. This rule takes precedence over State Rule.
8.  **Animal and horse projects must be owned (and leased horses as specified in this document) solely by and under the exhibitor's care and management and under the supervision of the organization in which the project will be shown as specified below. Animal projects may NOT be shown by another person at ANY other show/jackpot regardless of the other shows' rules, within the animal's ownership period. The official ownership date is the date shown on the receipt of sale unless the animal was bred by the exhibitor. The days are counted prior to the opening day of the fair unless the event in the case of horse shows is held separately from the Fair. Ownership must be maintained through show date(s) of fair or event.**

SHOW CONDITION

ANIMAL CARE

1. Any inhumane or other inappropriate action to animals by an exhibitor may cause disqualification, forfeiture of awards, and removal of the exhibit and/or exhibitor from

the Fairgrounds. This includes failure to clean stalls and/or failure to feed and water animal(s) daily.

2. Bedding for all stalls and pens will NOT be provided.
3. All Junior Livestock Exhibitors shall take responsibility for caring and grooming his/her own animals. If assistance is needed it should be intended to help the student learn new skills. All exhibitors can be assisted by immediate family members and other active exhibitors, eligible to show at the 2026 Monterey County Fair. This rule will be strictly enforced.
4. Exhibitors may have assistance in showing if THE EXHIBITOR has more than one entry in a class. The assistant must be in the same organization and must be in appropriate uniform.
5. All Dairy Goats and Dairy Cattle exhibitors must milk their own animals. No Exceptions.
6. All Beef, Dairy Cattle and Swine washing operations will be performed in wash racks. Sheep can wash in Dairy wash racks. In the event of a severe drought, washing may be limited during the Fair and will be posted in the Livestock Department.
7. Show rings will not be used for tying, feeding, or drying of animals. All Blocking Chutes for all species in designated areas ONLY.
8. ANIMALS MUST BE KEPT IN THE BARN AREA AT ALL TIMES.
9. Feed, bedding, tools, and other show equipment must be stored outside of aisles and walkways.
10. PENS/STALLS MUST BE CLEANED BY 8:00 AM EACH DAY.
11. Electrical extension cords shall be for temporary use only and of the heavy duty three-wire (grounded), hard-usage type. Two wire extension cords shall not be allowed. All extension cords shall be protected from physical damage and shall be limited to 20' in length.
12. The use of stimulants or depressants will not be permitted. Animals must be manageable by the exhibitor and broken to lead. Animals found unmanageable will be removed from the Fairgrounds at the discretion of Fair Management.

SICK OR AILING ANIMALS

1. If there is an indication of any unhealthy animals at the Fair, such animals will be removed immediately and will not receive premiums, if awarded.
2. To eliminate delay in treatment of a sick or ailing animal, the owner extends authority to take such action as deemed expedient and necessary to the Fair Management, when and after diligent attempts have been made to contact the owner or agent of said animal. Fair Management has Power of Attorney for the exhibitor in this instance and by virtue of entering the Monterey County Fair, the 7th District Agricultural Association will not assume any cost for action taken pursuant to this rule.
3. A VETERINARIAN WILL BE ON CALL FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS. THE EXHIBITOR MUST ASSUME ALL THE EXPENSE OF THE VETERINARIAN'S SERVICE IF NEEDED. THIS INCLUDES A SERVICE CHARGE.
4. Livestock Show Management with the best interest of the Fair in mind, shall reserve the right to declare ineligible for competition and/or disqualify any entry from the Junior Livestock Auction that is unsightly, unhealthy, injured, lame, unsound, unable to move on animal's free will, endangers public safety, violates Local Rules or the Fair's Code of Practice or has been entered in violation of these rules and regulations at any time.

LIVESTOCK WASH RACK RULES

1. Livestock are to arrive at the fair 'show ready.
2. Each species shall be washed only in the properly designated washing area.
3. All hoses must be free of leaks and have a shut off nozzle attached.
4. Exhibitors may clean animals using a spray bottle or bucket.

SPECIAL BEEF AND DAIRY CATTLE RULES

1. Transportation permits for Beef and Dairy Cattle are mandatory in transporting cattle to and from the Fair. Slips must accompany animals at the scale. Animals will not be weighed without proper paperwork.
2. Market Beef must have a Fair-provided tag in when they arrive on grounds.
3. **FEMALES:** All females twenty-four (24) months of age or older at the beginning day of the Fair must
 - a. have a calf at side, or
 - b. show obvious signs of pregnancy, or
 - c. have a veterinarian certificate for pregnancy.
4. A yellow transportation slip (74-0364) must accompany all cattle.
5. A permanent ear tag or tattoo number is required and must be shown on online entry and will be read at show ring prior to entering ring.
6. Unruly Animals - for public safety, management may disqualify any animal deemed unsafe. If an animal is disqualified it will be required to leave the fairgrounds immediately.

SPECIAL SWINE RULES

1. Market Hogs must have a Fair-provided tag in when they arrive on grounds.
2. No Snares are permitted on grounds or to be used on hogs.
3. If swine are imported directly from states classified Pseudorabies Eradication Program Stage I, II or III, a negative pseudorabies test is required within 30 days before entry in California. These swine must be isolated from other swine and cannot be exhibited until retested and found negative 30 to 60 days after entering California.
4. A regular California entry permit will not be granted for swine vaccinated for pseudorabies however, AHFSS, CDFA may grant a special California entry permit with specific limitation for such swine.
5. **Prop 12 Requirements:** Each exhibitor entering swine at the 2026 Monterey County Fair must submit a Prop 12 Certificate no later than August 1 with online entries.
6. Unruly Animals - for public safety, management may disqualify any animal deemed unsafe. If an animal is disqualified it will be required to leave the fairgrounds immediately.

SPECIAL SHEEP AND GOAT RULES

1. Market Sheep and Goats must have a Fair-provided tag in when they arrive on grounds.
2. ALL Sheep and Goats will be inspected at the scale by a fair designated official. Animals showing evidence of Fungus or other diseases deemed contagious or harmful to others will be required to load out and leave the Monterey County Fairgrounds IMMEDIATELY. no Exceptions.
3. Muzzling of animals is prohibited.
4. All Market and Breeding Lambs must be docked such that the tail (dock) can be lifted. Lambs that have been re-docked or have complete tail removal will not be eligible. SEE STATE RULE IX ANIMALS SPECIES.
5. No nurse goats or sheep shall be brought to the Fair with Market Lambs.
6. Sheep and Goats will remove halters across this scale. No slinkies, leg wraps or blankets are allowed across the scale.
7. Unruly Animals - for public safety, management may disqualify any animal deemed unsafe. If an animal is disqualified it will be required to leave the fairgrounds immediately.

SCALE RULES

- 1. CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, GOATS AND MEAT PENS:** Market livestock will be classified by weight by Certified Weigh Master on scales provided for that purpose on the Fairgrounds. **THERE WILL BE NO PRE-WEIGHS.**
2. Sheep and Goats will remove halters before going across this scale. No slinkies, leg wraps or blankets are allowed across the scale.
3. All animals must come across the scale completely natural in an unaltered state. No Paints, Pastes or any type of altering substances may be present. If any substance is found on any animals, it will be grounds for disqualification, by discretion of management.
- 4. OVERWEIGHT/UNDERWEIGHT ANIMALS:** Overweight/Underweight animals are allowed to stay and participate in Showmanship, otherwise they must be removed from the property no later than 7pm on weigh day.
5. All animals must be clean and dry. Breeding animals must have a minimum of work done, clean and fit in show condition, prior to entering the show ring. Market lambs must have a minimum of carding, with no more than a seven (7) day fleece on their body. **THIS RULE WILL BE ENFORCED AT THE SCALES.** All animals that do not meet these requirements will not be weighed in and must be corrected before the 6:00 PM weigh-in deadline or they will be removed from the grounds and disqualified.
- 6. NO RE-WEIGHS** will be permitted unless the scale is in question. In this case, the exhibitor must request the re-weigh immediately after the animal exits the scale. The animal may not leave the scale area. Fair Staff will reset the scale, balance the scale and re-weigh the animal only one time.. If the animal leaves the scale area there is no option for a re-weigh regardless of circumstance or reason.

RESIDUE AVOIDANCE PROGRAM

1. Monterey County Fair reserves the right to test any animal officially entered in any division for foreign substance including drugs, chemicals, or feed additives. As a prior condition to accepting an entry, a Declaration of Medication form (found in this book) signed by the exhibitor, Agriculture Instructor, 4-H Leader, Parent or Legal Guardian grants Monterey County Fair permission to test entry animal. This Form must accompany animal at scale.
2. Animals testing positive for an unapproved foreign substance including drugs, chemicals, or feed additives, will be disqualified and declared ineligible. Carcasses of disqualified animals will be disposed of per written instructions from USDA or FDA. If entry is disqualified, no changes will be made in the placing of other animals and the owner and members of his/her immediate family will not be eligible to compete in future Monterey County Fair programs. With passage of law AB489, the seller of animals found to contain residues is liable for triple civil damages plus attorney fees. Federal meat inspectors will be sampling show animals at the packing plants, looking for residues of antibiotics, tranquilizers, and sedatives. Carcasses that are positive are condemned, and the FDA and CDFA are notified so enforcement action can be taken.
3. If foreign substance residues including drugs, chemicals, or feed additives are found in tissues of carcass of animals sold through the Junior Livestock Auction Sale, Monterey County Fair will in no way be liable or responsible for conditions of carcass or sale price of animals. If, for any reason, any part of a carcass must be removed by USDA inspectors, sale price will be discounted accordingly.
4. Test samples collected from any animal must have zero tolerance for any identifiable or unidentifiable foreign substance including drugs, chemicals, or feed additives, unless otherwise established as permissible by the USDA or FDA. Premiums and sale proceeds will be withheld until tests are completed. Expense of testing will be paid by exhibitor.

- 5. POSTMORTEM EXAMINATIONS:** Monterey County Fair reserves the right to perform a postmortem examination of any animal which dies at Monterey County Fair. If required, this must be performed by an official veterinarian at the expense of the exhibitor.
6. Junior Livestock Auction Declaration of Animal Medication Form **MUST** accompany animal on WEIGH-IN DAY.
7. It is extremely important that withdrawal periods be strictly complied with for all medications used in animals that are going to market. These withdrawal times and approved uses are listed on the labels of each medication. If a use or species is not found on the label, it is not legal for that purpose, and this medication should not be used.

SHOWMANSHIP

8. Animals shown in showmanship must be owned by the exhibitor, entered by the exhibitor and shown in an appropriate market or breeding class. If the exhibitor has a market animal that does not meet the weight requirements and as a result may not show in an individual market class, the exhibitor may use this animal for showmanship if and only if this animal is the only animal the exhibitor has brought to the Fair.
9. **Showmanship is Mandatory** for all 4-H, FFA, Grange, and Independent Livestock Market Animal exhibitors, excluding all poultry and rabbit exhibitors.
10. **NO UNALTERED MALES** allowed in Showmanship Divisions, except Rabbits, Poultry and Dairy Divisions.
11. **AGE REQUIRED FOR SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES IS THE EXHIBITOR'S AGE AS OF DECEMBER 31, 2025, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF RABBIT EXHIBITORS. AGE REQUIRED FOR RABBIT SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES IS THE EXHIBITOR'S AGE ON DAY OF SHOW.**
12. **Top Two WINNERS** of each class may progress and compete in the next class **ONLY** if there is a Showmanship Class offered.
13. **4-H PRIMARY SHOWMANSHIP:** 4-H Youth aged 5 to 8 years. Limited to **RABBIT** and **POULTRY** Exhibitors **ONLY**.
 - This Division has no entry fee.
 - No premiums or awards money are offered for this Division.
14. **MASTER SHOWMANSHIP:** Top two (2) winners of 4-H Senior and FFA Senior Showmanship for **SHEEP, SWINE, MARKET GOATS, and BEEF ONLY** may progress and compete in Master Showmanship competition. Top two (2) 4-H Senior and top two (2) FFA Senior showmen will show together; one Master Showman will be chosen.

1st Place per Specie – Award & Ribbon

SHOWMANSHIP CLASSIFICATIONS

- 4-H Novice:** Exhibitor aged 9, 10 or 11 who has never shown this animal species in Showmanship at any Fair.
- 4-H Junior:** Exhibitor aged 9-13 who has previously shown this animal species at any Fair, and Exhibitor aged 12-13 who has never shown this animal species at any Fair.
- 4-H Senior:** Exhibitor aged 14-19 who has previously shown this animal species in Showmanship at any Fair, and Exhibitor aged 14-19 who has never shown this species in Showmanship at any Fair.
- FFA Novice:** Exhibitor must have never shown this animal species in Showmanship at any Fair.
- FFA Senior:** Exhibitor who has previously shown this animal species in Showmanship at any Fair.

PASSES AND CREDENTIALS

1. All junior livestock exhibitors are required to purchase a \$30.00 Livestock Exhibitor Wristband at the time of entering their projects. A sibling/parent pass for \$30.00 may be sold to livestock exhibitor families. Exhibitors may only purchase 1 Exhibitor pass and a maximum of four (4) Parent/Sibling passes.

2. If Exhibitor Wristband is tampered with, lost, or confiscated the exhibitor will have to purchase a replacement for \$30.00.
3. The Monterey County Fair would like to continue FREE passes for advisors and leaders. Additional passes needed may still be purchased for \$30.00 each. These passes will be available in your club packet. NO REFUNDS WILL BE PROCESSED OR OFFERED FOR PASSES PURCHASED.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION

1. A Junior Livestock Auction will be held at Monterey County Fairgrounds. Only animals exhibited at the Monterey County Fair in the Junior Livestock Department will be eligible for sale.
2. It is the sole responsibility of each exhibitor to take his/her own animal or project through the auction ring. Failure to do so will include forfeiture of awards, premiums, and sale proceeds.
3. ALL Auction checks will be held for a minimum of sixteen (16) days after Auction, except for any animal found to have residues in tissues of carcass. Premium awards and auction payments will be paid only as recorded on the signed judging sheet and/or Junior Livestock Auction sales records and only to the exhibitor. Checks may be picked up on the designated day as listed in the Entry Guidebook by the exhibitor only. If the exhibitor is under the age of 18, a parent or guardian may be designated to pick up check payment. Verification of parent or guardian will be requested at pick up. ALL JLA & Trophy Sponsor Thank You notes must be turned in by the designated day of check pick up. Checks will not be released unless all Thank You letters are submitted. All premium and auction checks must be cashed within 90 days; there will be a replacement fee of \$50.00 plus bank fees for each check.
4. Monterey County Fair Junior Livestock Auction is a **TERMINAL SALE**, all animals deemed market ready and judged will be sold through the auction. **Once an animal is judged and deemed market ready**
5. Exhibitors must be present in uniform of their respective organization to sell their animal.
6. The owner of the animals shall have his/her animal ready at the time of sale to be sold. No exceptions will be made except in extreme emergencies.
7. All animals must be presented in Show Condition. Exhibitors **CANNOT DECORATE THEIR ANIMALS: NO GLITTERS.**
8. No breeding stock will be sold through the auction ring.
9. A 9.0% selling charge will be collected on all livestock sold, and \$2.00 will be deducted from all Market Beef sales for the California Beef Council. A .004% selling charge for Swine for Pork Promotion will also be charged.
10. A \$20.00 charge will be withheld from exhibitor checks for all animals to cover the cost of two (2) 5"x7" color pictures taken of exhibitor and animal.
11. **Every exhibitor** of livestock is **REQUIRED** to write a **Thank You** letter to buyers of their animals. Any exhibitor not fulfilling this requirement is subject to being barred from selling at future sales of the Monterey County Fair Junior Livestock Auction.
12. The Change of Ownership of any animal sold through the Auction does not change to buyer of said animal until the exhibitor is released from the Fairgrounds at 5:00 PM on last day of Livestock Show/Fair. Any exhibitor dismissed from the Monterey County Fair for misconduct will forfeit payment of animal sold through the Livestock Auction and buyer of that animal will be released from any obligation for payment. The offending exhibitor will not be allowed to enter or exhibit again at the Monterey County Fair.
13. For animals that become deceased after the junior livestock auction, the owner/exhibitor of said animal will forfeit payment for animal and be required to return the

check to Auction Chairman, and the buyer of the animal shall be released from any obligation.

14. Monterey County Fair Junior Livestock Auction Committee discourages exhibitors from giving alcohol as a buyer's gift. The Heritage Foundation will be selling gift certificates to give as a gift option.

6. All Market Beef MUST NOT have horns exceeding 2 inches.
7. 4-H and FFA Entries must each exceed 5 heads to be broken into separate divisions. Otherwise, both divisions will be shown together and broken into appropriate weight classes.
8. **No Premiums are offered for Market Beef classes.**

1. **Registration Papers:** All purebred sheep must be registered and recorded by a recognized breed association in the name of the exhibitor. Joint ownership with siblings only is permitted as long as the ewe is entered and exhibited solely in the name of one individual junior exhibitor and that exhibitor is one of the siblings listed on the registration paper issued by the breed association. Ewes with a farm, ranch, or non-sibling owner's name listed as the owner will NOT be allowed to compete. No pending papers will be accepted.

1. This is an ARBA sanctioned show. Single Youth Rabbit Show. ARBA rules will be enforced and followed.
2. ARBA Sanction Number: YYA3491. Official American Rabbit Breeders Association Sanctioned Show, PO Box 400, Knox, PA 16232. www.arba.net. Membership dues are listed on the ARBA website. Note: ARBA membership is not required to enter the show; however, youth must be ARBA members in order to receive points.
3. Rabbits should be entered into classes based on weight and age according to ARBA guidelines. Animals will be shown and judged in classes recognized by ARBA and judged by a currently licensed ARBA judge.
4. ARBA sanctioned single youth show open to exhibitors residing in the State of California. Meat pen, pet class and showmanship entries are limited to exhibitors located in Monterey, Santa Cruz, and San Benito Counties ONLY. See Junior Livestock Department Rules, Entry Information.
5. **Market Rabbits:** Limit of two (2) meat pen entries per Exhibitor. **Breed and Fur Rabbits:** Per State Rules, exhibitors may not earn more than two (2) cash prizes per class.
6. A Meat Pens shall consist of three (3) rabbits. No extra rabbits will be allowed onto the Fairgrounds to be added to a pen if the original pen does not meet weight requirements.
7. The Junior Market Rabbit Meat Pen show is a TERMINAL show for the Top 5 placing pens. The top 5 Rabbit Meat Pens selected by the judge shall remain on Fairgrounds and be sold during the Junior Livestock Auction.
8. Rules, definitions, and judging procedures as prescribed in the latest edition of the Guidebook and Standard of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. shall apply to all District and County Fair rabbit shows, provided they do not conflict with any rules and regulations prescribed by the Department of Food and Agriculture.
9. Breed and Fur Rabbits must have a legible, permanent number, symbol, letter, or series of either or both tattooed in its left ear, which must correspond with those on the online entries.
10. Duplication of ear markings by one exhibitor in the same Breed and Class will not be allowed. Entries with duplicate ear numbers will have one of those rabbits eliminated. The entry fee will not be returned.
11. Breed and Fur Rabbits will be shown and judged in divisions recognized by the ARBA.
12. It is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor to take the rabbit to the show table when the class is called for it to be judged. Exhibitors may be assisted by other eligible members showing at the 2026 Monterey County Fair.
13. **The exhibitor is to check the show cards at the beginning of the Rabbit Show and report any discrepancies to the Show Secretary immediately. No changes will be allowed during the show. Substitutions can only be made within the same division, sex variety, and class. This must be received in writing five days prior to the show date.**
14. Breed and Fur Rabbits: Pedigree papers or a Bill of Sale showing the required ownership period (30 days) may be used instead of a pedigree if ear number and other required entry information are shown on the Bill of Sale. This should be available on request on the day of the show.
15. It is the Exhibitor's sole responsibility to care for, feed, and water the rabbits.
16. Exhibitors shall maintain clean, dry bedding for their entries.
17. An Exhibitor participating in Junior Livestock Auction may purchase a Livestock Exhibitor Wristband for \$30.00. Exhibitors participating in Junior Livestock Auction are required to always have animals on grounds and are responsible for cleaning, feeding, and caring for these animals.
18. Showmanship is NOT Mandatory for rabbit exhibitors. Pre-entry is required for Showmanship if you choose to participate.
19. Pre-entry for Showmanship is Mandatory. Animal used in showmanship MUST belong to Exhibitor and be entered in one of the Breed and Fur Rabbits Divisions. Highest placing 4-H Junior, 4-H Senior, FFA Novice and FFA Senior showmen advance to Round Robin.

Rules, definitions, and judging procedure as prescribed in the latest edition of the *Official Show Rules and the Standard of Perfection* of the American Poultry Association, Inc., shall apply to the Monterey County Fair Poultry Show except in such instances where they conflict with rules and regulations prescribed by State and Local Rules listed in this Guidebook.
2. Birds will be shown and judged in the proper Division and Class for breed, variety, age, and sex only. If no Class is offered, no awards may be made.
3. Monterey County Fair remains committed to hosting a quality Poultry Exhibition. Health checks are mandated by the Division of Fairs & Expositions and will be performed by certified Poultry Health Inspectors (PHI) from one of the designated CDFA/UC Certification Programs.
 - The PHI will evaluate the health and condition of every bird entered. As a result, coop in times may be delayed.
 - Look for signs as you enter the Fairgrounds as to where to take your bird(s) for the examination—do not proceed to the Poultry Barn until your bird(s) have been examined.
 - Make sure you carefully examine each bird before you leave home and follow your regular cleaning procedures.
 - Any birds that show signs of illness, stress, or are not in top quality condition will not be allowed to enter the show.
 - Birds with wing feathers or any other feathers that have been clipped or trimmed will be disqualified.
4. For all classes of Standard-Bred chickens and ducks, all birds must be identified by leg bands or wing bands conforming with the online entry on arrival at the show. No changes will be made on the day of Judging.
5. Substitutions can only be made within a division.
6. It is not mandatory that a first-place award be given if there is no entry in the Class or Division worthy of such placing.
7. All birds are entered at the owner's risk. The Fair and its management are not responsible for any thefts or injuries that may occur to the birds.
8. If a division does not have at least 10 entries, it may be combined with another division and judged as one.
9. All entries must be checked by the Show Superintendent before cooping in.
10. If there are more than 10 entries of the same breed a separate division will be created and judged.
11. Definitions of Classes:
 - **COCK OR OLD DRAKE** – Male 1 year or older

4. Each participant will show all four (4) species – Beef, Sheep, Swine, Meat Goats.

6. Participant must provide their own equipment i.e., cane, show stick, etc.
7. Only 4-H and FFA exhibitors from Monterey, Santa Cruz and San Benito counties are eligible.
8. Any contestant suspected of misconduct will be immediately disqualified by management.
9. An official uniform of the organization is required for all 4H and FFA Exhibitors while competing in all Divisions and while receiving awards during the 2026 Monterey County Fair.

CLEAN BARN AWARD

DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Purpose: to encourage exhibitors in the livestock area (you) to maintain a clean, presentable, safe display of animals for the public and exhibitors themselves.
2. All exhibits will be judged. We encourage your participation. The judge will report all exhibits not maintained to the livestock office.
3. Judging will take place twice daily between 8:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. Unannounced visits can occur anytime the judge feels necessary. Times to be judged will not be announced. All scores must be ready by Monday AM.
4. The judge will be made aware of show times and weigh schedules, but all areas will be judged daily. The public comes every day, as you do, and deserves a neat, presentable, safe area.
5. FFA and 4-H Beef, Dairy, Swine, Sheep and Goat exhibits are eligible.
6. 100 points total per day can be earned. Overall the Fair winner will be the Club and Chapter with the highest five-day total for each specie.
7. FFA and 4-H will be judged separately. Club/Chapter displays are part of clean barn. All decorations and displays will be installed and constructed by exhibitors. Parents are to supervise only.
8. On the judging score card General Appearance is just that. The general eye appeal of the area. Identifications include signs, stall cards, and any other identifying marks. Condition of Animals - pigs and sheep should be in their respective pens. Beef and dairy should be securely tied in the barn.
9. Scores will be posted daily as soon as possible after judging.
10. All judges' decisions are final.
12. There shall be no hassling of the judges by the parents, leaders, or exhibitors during or after judging. Clubs or chapters who don't respect this rule will be automatically disqualified from the competition.
13. Winners will be announced at the Awards Breakfast on Monday at 9:00 AM.
14. If pens are not identifiable as to which chapter or club they belong, they will not be judged.
15. No entry is required.
16. Clubs and chapters are encouraged to include an educational display as part of their presentation.

2026 JUNIOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR CODE OF CONDUCT & PARENT/LEADER/ADULT CODE OF CONDUCT

REQUIRED FOR ALL EXHIBITORS

This Code of Conduct was developed by the 7th District Agricultural Association (DAA), who operates under the auspices of the California Department of Food and Agriculture, Division of Fairs and Expositions, for the primary purpose of producing the annual Monterey County Fair.

The Code of Conduct is further enhanced with additional rules and regulations, including the State Rules.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR CODE OF CONDUCT (PART I)

POLICIES FOR EXHIBITOR CONDUCT

1. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is PROHIBITED.
2. Exhibitors shall use respectful language. No foul or abusive language or gestures will be tolerated.
3. All Junior Livestock Exhibitors shall take responsibility for caring and grooming for his/her own animals. If assistance is needed it should be intended to help the exhibitor learn and gain new skills. All Exhibitors can be assisted by immediate family members and other active 4H/FFA members, eligible to show at the 2026 MCF. The Fair's designated Livestock Species Superintendent will oversee barns and enforce all rules.
4. Exhibitors acknowledge that the Monterey County Fair Junior Livestock Auction is a TERMINAL SALE, all Market Acceptable/Market Ready animals judged will be sold through the auction.
5. Possession of any weapon or illegal drugs on the Fairgrounds is prohibited.
6. Possession of alcohol or consumption of alcoholic beverages on the Fairgrounds, and/or being under the influence by any underage exhibitor (minor) on the Fairgrounds is prohibited.
7. Use of fireworks or sparklers is prohibited on the Fairgrounds. Smoking or vaping of any kind is allowed only in the designated location on the Fairgrounds and not allowed by any underage exhibitors.
8. Any exhibitor whose conduct jeopardizes the health and safety of another exhibitor, animal, or the public, will be immediately expelled from further participation in the 2026 Monterey County Fair and possibly future fairs. The exhibitor and their animal(s) are to be removed from the grounds immediately and lose the opportunity to show and sell his/her animal(s) through the Junior Livestock Auction. Health or Safety issues include, but are not limited to, actions involving weapons, alcohol, illegal drugs, or fireworks, as mentioned in items 5-7 above, and not caring for, i.e. feeding and watering, the exhibitor's animal project.
9. If animal(s) have been sold in the Junior Livestock Auction and Rule 8 needs to be enforced the animals will remain on the grounds.

POLICIES FOR ANIMAL TREATMENT

1. Any effort to artificially change the conformation or appearance of an animal by treating the animal, internally or externally, with any irritant, counter-irritant, or other substance is considered unethical, inhumane, and is prohibited. Treatments that are prohibited include, but are not limited to, the use of artificial hair coloring (sprays, etc.), excessive use of common products such as fly spray, ointments or liniments, or other similar products. Excessive use is defined as the use of a substance to the point that it irritates the animal. For reference, livestock can be fit with livestock show supply spray paint from the knees and hocks down. Cattle may have livestock show supply spray paint applied to tail heads, tails, and tail switches.
2. Adding false hair or hair-like material, fleece, or skin to any portion of the animal's body is not allowed and will result in immediate disqualification. Causing the animal to ingest any liquid or substance not considered part of an accepted and normal livestock diet, or in quantities not considered normal for livestock, is deemed illegal and inhumane. For example: the use of alcoholic or carbonated beverages as a drench or filler.
3. The use of tranquilizers, sedatives, or depressants, which alter the physical or physiological state of the animal, is not allowed. Exceptions to this rule would be a California Licensed Certified Veterinarian's treatment for recognized disease or injury, or recommendation for tranquilizing breeding animals in heat that might compromise the safety of others. The Livestock Office must receive notification from the Licensed Certified Veterinarian of the details of any such prescribed treatment in writing. The substance used in this treatment must have been approved by The Food and Drug Administration for use in meat producing animals.
4. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to feed, water and care for any animal they have entered in the Fair throughout the entire Livestock Show, including any period following the sale of the animal prior to the end of the Show/Fair (with exception of dates in Section 1, Policy 4). **All market animals must be cared for and are the responsibility of the exhibitor until 5:00 pm on Monday, September 7, 2026.**
5. Any animal that appears ill or injured while at the Fairgrounds must be reported to the livestock office. A veterinarian must check any animal considered unhealthy. If it is determined that the animal is carrying a communicable disease, the animal will be removed from the Fairgrounds. The Fairgrounds will not assume the cost for this action. The exhibitor must assume the full expense of the veterinarian's services.
6. Any animal that is determined to be unmanageable, or could be a safety hazard to the public, will be removed

- from the Fairgrounds. The Livestock Superintendent/Fair Management makes this decision final.
7. It is considered abuse to excessively shrink or excessively exercise an animal.
 8. Other than to reduce higher than normal body temperature of an animal that is overheated, ice is not to be applied to the body of an animal. Ice in a bucket of water is permitted. No cooling devices, electrical stimulation tools or shockers may be used. Ice used to cool down the body temperature of a hog is acceptable.
 9. Physical abuse of an animal will not be tolerated. For example: when moving hogs, care should be taken not to excessively beat or hit an animal (either by a person or with an object).
 10. For the safety of the animal and the public, animals are not to be left unattended on fitting tables or in blocking chutes.
 11. All lambs and goats must be shown with their front feet on the ground as practiced by acceptable showmanship procedures. If this policy is not followed, the judge may ask the exhibitor to leave the ring.
 12. During animal weigh-in, while at the scale, or any time during the Fair or on arrival times, all sheep and goats will be checked for any infectious disease, open sores, abscesses, injury, parasites, or any unhealthy condition. Those animals determined to have an infectious disease will be asked to immediately leave the fairgrounds. For example: animals found to have live active Ringworm, or active Sore Mouth will be asked to leave the fairgrounds. It is strongly suggested that the health of each animal be evaluated prior to coming to the Fair. The Fair Association is not responsible for any costs associated with the transfer or care of these animals.
 13. Exhibitors should remember that the cost of the junior livestock programs are offset in part by the general public, therefore the livestock area needs to be presentable at all times. All livestock stalls/pens must be cleaned out daily before 8:00 AM and exhibitors should make every effort to keep the barns clean at all times for the public.
 14. Exhibitors shall be responsible for the security of their animals in stalls or pens. All beef cattle and dairy cattle shall be securely tied with a neck rope in addition to a suitable halter. All sheep, goat, and swine pens shall be securely closed and fastened before the exhibitor leaves the barn area. Please do not put padlocks on any gates or pens.

CONSEQUENCES FOR VIOLATION OF EXHIBIT POLICIES

1. If any violation of policy occurs prior to the junior livestock auction, the exhibitor will not be allowed to sell his/her animal.
2. If the violation occurs after the Junior Livestock Auction, the exhibitor will receive only market resale value (as determined the day of the auction) for the animal. Any remaining money paid by the buyer in purchasing the animal through the auction will be placed into a general scholarship fund or put towards educational purposes at the Fair. The buyer will receive the animal.
3. If it is determined that an exhibitor has violated the Fair's Code of Conduct or other exhibit policies, the exhibitor will be removed from the grounds and may not exhibit livestock at the following year's fair. For example: An exhibitor who violates a rule and is removed from the grounds in 2026 will not be allowed to exhibit livestock at the 2026 Fair. The exhibitor may then request in writing to exhibit livestock at the 2027 Fair. This request will be reviewed by the Board of Directors prior to an official entry being accepted.
4. Direction shall be focused more on the exhibitors excelling in leadership, education, and citizenship with their livestock projects.

5. Minor violations of exhibit conduct, not involving health or safety concerns, may be given one (1) verbal warning. This verbal warning will be documented and noted by a signature from the exhibitor and Livestock Superintendent or Fair Management. On the second violation, the exhibitor will be asked to leave the fairgrounds, and any awards and/or auction check will be withheld.

ELIGIBLE ENTRIES

1. All 4-H, FFA and Independent entries must be submitted online and must have an electronic approval as designated by management. Entries also must have electronic approval by the exhibitor, his/her parent or guardian, and leader/advisor.
2. All Code of Conduct Agreement Forms must be signed by exhibitors and their parent/guardian to be considered eligible.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION

The auction is a privilege, not a right. You are producing a product that will enter the food chain. The Fair's goal is not only to provide a seller with an avenue to sell, but also provide a consumer/buyer with quality, healthy, produced products from knowledgeable and responsible producers.

1. Every market animal exhibitor at Monterey County Fair is required to complete a Declaration of Animal Medication prior to selling an animal at the Junior Livestock Auction. Animals will not be eligible to sell if the Medication Form is not completed and properly signed.
2. Exhibitors, as owner of their market animals, acknowledge that they will be responsible for their animal if rejected at a harvesting plant due to the presence of drug or other residue. If drug or other residue is detected, the exhibitor understands that he/she may be liable to the buyer and/or Fair for an amount equal to three (3) times the purchase price and may also be liable for any attorney's fees and civil penalties.

SELLER'S RESPONSIBILITY

1. All animals must follow the sale order as determined and compiled by Fair staff. Failure of the exhibitor to be present and ready to enter the ring with their animal will automatically disqualify the exhibitor from the sale.
2. No advertisement will be permitted on animals. Do not ask the auctioneer for special announcements. Adornments are permitted on Champion and Reserve Champion Market animals only. No exceptions.
3. All exhibitors must write Thank You letters to their auction buyers and turn them in at the Exhibitor's Awards Breakfast on Monday, September 7th.
4. Exhibitors selling livestock through the Auction are solely responsible for feeding, watering, and general well-being of their own animals until the animals are loaded onto trucks for transport.
5. No parent, leader/advisor or exhibitor shall contact buyers for the purpose of purchasing, re-purchasing or giving back an auctioned animal.

CONDEMNED CARCASS

1. In the case of a condemned carcass due to drug or chemical contamination, contagious disease, or sign of genetic disease syndrome exhibitors will forfeit earnings and all premiums and pay all costs associated with expenses.

SOLICITATION OF BUYERS/NON-SALE MARKET ANIMALS

1. Absolutely no "For Sale" signs will be allowed in the barn area. Any exhibitor found soliciting buyers for non-sale market animals before or during the Auction will be subject to disciplinary action as determined by Fair Management.

PARENT/ADULT CODE OF CONDUCT (PART II)

As a Parent or Guardian of a Livestock Exhibitor at the Monterey County Fair, you are expected to adhere to the following Code of Conduct. Failure to do so will jeopardize the participation of your club, the exhibitors, your child, or any member of your family.

1. As a Leader/Advisor or parent, I acknowledge that the child must demonstrate his or her ownability, knowledge, and skill as an exhibitor of show animals, and that the assistance of an adult in the washing, grooming, fitting, or showing of his or her animal while at the Fair is prohibited. Verbal assistance by an adult is acceptable.
2. As a Leader/Advisor or parent, I acknowledge that direct criticism or interference with the judge, show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is PROHIBITED. All judges, Fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect, and as a Leader/Advisor or Parent I will not allow any person connected with my exhibitor's or child's animal project to direct abusive or threatening conduct toward any show official.
3. Leader/Advisor and Parents shall use respectful language. No foul or abusive language or gestures will be tolerated in the Livestock Area or on the fairgrounds.
4. Possession of any weapons or illegal drugs on the fairgrounds is prohibited.
5. As a parent, I/We are aware that responsible alcohol use is allowed on the Fairgrounds, and I/We will limit use of alcohol so that a proper example is set for my exhibitor child, or children of others around us. Any child/student or children/students of other club/chapters around us. Any abuse of alcohol or public intoxication by Parent in or around the Livestock facility is PROHIBITED. This type of activity is further monitored by law enforcement.

6. As a parent, I/We agree not to bring or store any outside alcohol in the livestock area. ONLY alcohol provided by the Master Concessionaire is allowed on the grounds. If caught with outside alcohol Parent will be removed from the fairgrounds for the remainder of the Fair.
7. As a Leader/Advisor or Parent I acknowledge that the use of fireworks or sparklers is prohibited on the fairgrounds.
8. Smoking or vaping is allowed only in the designated smoking area. Smoking or vaping of any kind is PROHIBITED in the livestock area.

Any Parent/Guardian whose conduct jeopardizes the health or safety of an exhibitor, animal, or the public, will be immediately expelled from the Monterey County Fair and will jeopardize the participation of their club/chapter's exhibitors or any member of the Parent's family. The Parent is to be removed from the grounds immediately and could jeopardize their club's exhibitors or child's opportunity to show and sell through the Junior Livestock Auction. By signing this Agreement, all parties (livestock exhibitors of market, breeding, and small animals and their parents or guardian), do hereby agree to the Junior Livestock Exhibitor and Parent/Adult Code of Conduct as expressly stated above. All Code of Conduct forms are to be viewed at submission of Fair Entry, which is on or before August 1, 2026. Code of Conduct forms must be signed and submitted by August 10. Failure to read and submit the signed agreement causes ineligibility to show at the 2026 Fair.

REQUIRED FOR ENTRY - BRING WEIGH IN DAY

Every market animal exhibitor at the MONTEREY COUNTY FAIR must complete this form prior to the sale of animals at the Junior Livestock Auction. Animals will not be eligible to sell in the 2026 Monterey County Fair Junior Livestock Auction if the form is not signed.

UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY, WE THE UNDERSIGNED CERTIFY THAT:

1. No Unauthorized chemicals have been used which would cause the carcass to fail USDA and/or Food and Drug Administration standards.
2. The withdrawal time required of any medication (including medicated feed) or pesticide administered has been adhered to.

AS THE OWNER OF THIS MARKET ANIMAL, I ACKNOWLEDGE I WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR MY ANIMAL IF IT IS REJECTED AT A PROCESSING CENTER DUE TO THE PRESENCE OF DRUG RESIDUES. IF DRUG RESIDUE IS DETECTED I MAY BE LIABLE TO THE BUYER FOR AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THREE TIMES THE PURCHASE PRICE AND MAY ALSO BE LIABLE FOR ATTORNEY'S FEES AND CIVIL PENALTIES (FOOD AND AGRICULTURE CODE SECTION 14363).
